 - Drinking Water/Clean Water State Revolving Funds (SRF)
 - Safe and Affordable Drinking Water (SADW) Fund



Funding Opportunities: Competitive Grants

- CalOES/FEMA
 - Building Resilient Infrastructure Communities (BRIC)/Hazard Mitigation
 - State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program
- California Air Resources Board / AQMD Clean Vehicle Funding
 - Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure
 - Vehicle Replacement/Vouchers



Funding Opportunities: State and Federal Earmarks

State Earmarks:

- Direct funding for specific projects
- Political, not competitive process
- Not transparent or advertised
- Dollar amounts depend on State Budget health
- Lay groundwork in Q1

Federal Earmarks (CPF, CDS)

- Direct grant awards to various programs
- Political, not competitive process
- Very transparent and structured
- Returned in FY 22, 0.5% to 1% of discretionary
- House Members get 15 projects
- Senate Members do not have a cap
- Application typical opens in February/March
